




LENT BEGINS WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 14


Lent begins this month on Ash Wednesday which is Wednesday, February 14. We will kick-off the Lenten season with a cooperative service at Noon on Feb. 14 at First Christian located directly across 6th Street from Trinity. Our friends at First Christian, St. John's Episcopal, and First Baptist join us in putting on this service every year. Join us at Noon for the service and the imposition of ashes as we enter into Lent and journey together towards the cross.

Trinity's Lenten services begin on Sunday, February 18th with our Lenten worship series Witness at the Cross, inspired by the book by Dr. Amy-Jill Levine which will also be our Lenten small group study book!








Over the course of Lent, we have an opportunity to examine our faith and relationship with Jesus. Often times, we can learn more about our relationship with Jesus, as well as our witness to him, by examining characters in the Scripture. Beginning Thursday, February 15, Pastor Ben will be leading a Lenten study inspired by Levine's book that focuses on the characters surrounding the cross on Good Friday.

During each of the six weeks, we will explore the various characters we see in the four Gospels, from the bystanders to the soldiers, The Beloved Disciple to Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus. The study will be on Thursdays at 5 p.m., starting on Feb. 15 and ending on March 21. Please let Pastor Ben know by February 9 if you would like to participate so that books can be made available! You do not have to be able to attend every session.



Looking ahead to Holy Week:

Pastor Ben and Pastor Mack will be teaming up to bring us our Good Friday service this year. More details to come, but save the date for Friday, March 29.

Join us on Easter Sunday, March 31 as we celebrate the empty tomb and our risen Savior. More details to come in next month's newsletter.


DISCIPI ESHIP

COMMUNION OFFERING CONTINUES TO HELP NEIGHBORS IN NEED

With the new year, there are changes in the way Trinity is channeling our financial support for vulnerable individuals and families in our community. In order to more efficiently connect folks seeking assistance with support, and also to enhance Trinity's support of Lafayette Urban Ministry, our assistance offering collected on Communion Sundays will now go directly to LUM's Good Samaritan Fund.

Every penny of this fund at LUM goes to financial assistance for utility bills, rent, prescription medications, work clothes, and food for folks in crisis in Greater Lafayette. Volunteers serve at LUM Monday through Friday morning to administer the Good Samaritan fund. This change will enable Trinity to partner with greater solidarity with LUM to serve our neighbors in need more effectively, and Pastor Suzanne is currently exploring opportunities with Wes Tillett, LUM's Executive Director.

Your Communion offering still meets the very same needs – the tangible needs of folks in crisis in our community. Your giving will just be channeled differently in the new year. Please continue to give so that Trinity can give compassionately to our neighbors in need. If you have questions, please reach out to Pastor Suzanne.

YOUR CHRISTMAS OFFERING MAKES A DIFFERENCE


At the end of last year, Trinity responded to the urgent needs of Family Promise by focusing our Christmas missions giving to this critical agency that serves unhoused families with children in our community. Trinity's Christmas offering to Family Promise totaled \$2,012. Thanks to all who gave to this important local mission!

FEBRUARY MISSION: FOWLER PANTRY

Trinity's February missions effort will support our neighbors at Fowler Apartments. Fowler is an affordable apartment community that serves senior adults and adults with disabilities, and a few of our Trinity members are part of the Fowler community. Stephanie Austin, services coordinator at Fowler, launched a new pantry at Fowler last year to assist residents with essentials that they need. Our February mission is a "pantry shower" for Fowler. Drop off any of these items in the bin on the first floor near the Trinity elevator during the month of February: toilet paper, paper towels, deodorant, detergent, toothpaste, toothbrushes, gloves, hats, and cleaning supplies.


YOUTH & FAMILIES

STAINED GLASS RESTORATION FUND



Our ongoing restoration project for our stained glass windows continues. The six stained glass windows on the south side of the Sanctuary are completely restored. Check out the dramatic improvement in appearance of these windows from the outside, which is very close to what they looked like when installed about 1920 by Edna Browning Ruby.

The final step for the south side windows is the placing of internal acrylic glazing for thermal insulation of the Sanctuary, which will occur this winter. The first window of the North side of the sanctuary has been removed and is being rebuilt at this time. By spring, six windows on this side will be rebuilt and reinstalled.

Your contributions help to fund this project alongside grant funding that we receive through the Division of Historic Preservation & Archaeology within the Department of Natural Resources (DNR).
