## MARCH MISSIONS SUPPORTS UNITED METHODIST RELIEF

Did you know that the United Methodist Church has one of the most respected and highly rated humanitarian relief efforts in the world? UMCOR (The United Methodist Committee on Relief) is recognized globally for the relief the UMC provides globally in response to natural or human-caused disasters. UMCOR is on the ground all over the world, alleviating suffering and providing emergency and long-term recovery in overwhelmed communities. Last fall, many at Trinity desired to respond to the need in Hawaii after the devastating wildfires. Through UMCOR, we donated $\$ 2,185$ for Hawaii wildfire relief.

Every year in March, UMCOR raises funds specifically for administrative costs. This effort allows UMCOR to spend the rest of the year raising funds that go directly to relief efforts. When you give in March, that means that throughout the rest of the year, about 98\% of giving goes straight to communities in need.

Trinity's missions offering in March will go toward UMCOR's administrative needs. And, this month, Trinity is requesting that you include your UMCOR giving in your regular giving. Trinity will be donating $\$ 1,000$ to UMCOR from our operating budget. Placing some of our missions in our operating budget signals that missions is a core value and part of our planned giving, not simply an additional gift. Please give generously, so that Trinity can provide support locally and globally to our neighbors in need. ## CARING MINISTRY CONNECTS WITH COMMUNITY PARTNERS

If you've been at Trinity for a while, it should come as no surprise that there is a housing crisis in our community. Pastor Suzanne has mentioned this several times. Our community, like many other areas in our nation, simply does not have enough affordable housing, and that means that individuals and families are suffering. Last year, Lafayette Urban Ministry and the Salvation Army collaborated to bring together churches and other agencies in our community to respond to folks in need through a bimonthly network gathering. Pastor Suzanne is part of this network, and this past month, she was able to reach out to this group and pool resources together for a single mother who was about to receive an eviction notice. Thanks to our community collaboration, this mother and her 8 -yr-old daughter were able to pay their rent on time and avoid eviction. Pastor Suzanne continues to administer our existing caring fund, even as our assistance offering now goes directly to Lafayette Urban Ministry. Pastor Suzanne is looking forward to increasing collaboration with our community partners as we work to serve our neighbors in need together.

## STAINED GLASS RESTORATION FUND



Our ongoing restoration project for our stained glass windows continues. The six stained glass windows on the south side of the Sanctuary are completely restored. Check out the dramatic improvement in appearance of these windows from the outside, which is very close to what they looked like when installed about 1920 by Edna Browning Ruby.

The final step for the south side windows is the placing of internal acrylic glazing for thermal insulation of the Sanctuary, which will occur this winter. The first window of the North side of the sanctuary has been removed and is being rebuilt at this time. By spring, six windows on this side will be rebuilt and reinstalled.

Your contributions help to fund this project alongside grant funding that we receive through the Division of Historic Preservation \& Archaeology within the Department of Natural Resources (DNR).
